CALL THE MEETING TO ORDER

Council President Bromberg called the meeting to order at 7:00pm at the Community Center located at 620 Rivervale Road, River Vale, New Jersey 07675.

SALUTE TO FLAG

Council President Bromberg asked all in attendance to rise and join him in a Salute to the Flag.

SUNSHINE LAW STATEMENT

Council President Bromberg read the Sunshine Statement into the record, as follows:

"In accordance with the provisions set forth in the Open Public Meetings Law, notification of this meeting has been sent to all officially appointed Township newspapers and notice is posted at the Municipal Office."

ROLL CALL

Councilman Ben-Yishay, Councilman Criscuolo, Councilwoman Sieg and Council President Bromberg were present. Councilman Donovan was absent.

Also present: Mayor Glen Jasionowski, Business Administrator/CFO Gennaro Rotella, Township Attorney Michael Caulfield, Township Engineer Chris Statile, Township Clerk Karen Campanelli, Judge Vincent Galasso Judge Richard Greenhalgh, Police Chief William Giordano, Fire Chief Steve Velthaus, Superintendent Rich Campanelli, former Police Chiefs McCann and Simpson and Assemblywoman Holly Schepisi.

Council Comments

Councilman Ben-Yishay welcomed everyone and commented that it's incredible to see such a great turnout for this evenings meeting. He added that this a testament as to how special this night is for the friends and families of our Police Officers who are receiving their well-deserved promotions.

Councilwoman Sieg welcomed everyone and congratulated the Police Officers. She also thanked the Officers for their service adding that their promotions are well deserved.

Councilman Criscuolo extended his congratulations to all those being promoted and thanked the Officers for their commitment to the residents of River Vale.

Council President Bromberg explained that one of the reasons for their success is that they surround themselves with excellent professionals. He added that it's an honor this evening to be surrounded by the best that law enforcement has to offer. Council President Bromberg further commented that the Mayor ran an exemplary promotion and hiring process and this evening is a culmination of that effort. He then offered his congratulations to the Officers.

Mayor Jasionowski welcomed everyone to this evenings meeting and commented on how wonderful it is to have such a big crowd this evening. He then congratulated the members of the Police Department being promoted and the new Officers being sworn in this evening. The Mayor commented that he is blessed to have excellent leadership structure in the Police Department. The hiring and promotions were primarily handled by the Police Department and every single decision made was a unanimous decision between the Police Department and the Administration.

The Mayor invited Assemblywoman Holly Schepisi to share her comments. Assemblywoman Schepisi explained that she has lived in River Vale for 14 years and feels she has grown up with some of the Officers being promoted this evening. She added that each Officer has been an amazing addition to the community

and has contributed to making River Vale the safest community in New Jersey. Assemblywoman Schepisi thanked each Officer being promoted individually and extended her congratulations to the new Officers as well.

PROCLAMATION “Recognizing River Vale as the Safest Town in New Jersey”

Mayor Jasionowski read the following Proclamation into the record.

Proclamation

Recognizing River Vale as the Safest Town in New Jersey

WHEREAS, on February 5, 2018 the National Council for Home Safety and Security formally released the results of their study ranking the Township of River Vale as the safest Town in New Jersey; and

WHEREAS, according to the study the Township of River Vale did not log a single violent crime in the latest year and boasted a property crime rate of 2.59 per 1,000 residents; and

WHEREAS, this impressive ranking can be attributed to the exceptional leadership and dedicated officers of the River Vale Police Department; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council also wish to thank and acknowledge all the Township Departments and volunteers that support the Police Department and help keep River Vale a safe and beautiful community; including the Township Administration, Fire Department, Ambulance Corps., OEM, CERT Team and Public Works Department.

NOW THEREFOR BE IT RESOLVED that the Mayor and Council call upon the residents to commemorate the officers of the River Vale Police Department for their devoted and faithful service to our community.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Mayor and Council proudly recognize the excellent and enduring reputation of the River Vale Police Department for protecting and keeping our community safe.

Police Department Promotions

The Mayor asked Captain Sean Scheidle to step forward. He then read a brief bio and accomplishments of Officer Scheidle into the record as follows:

Promotion of Sean G. Scheidle to Captain of Police

Sean Scheidle joined the River Vale Police Department in 1994. He has held the positions of Patrolman, Detective, Detective Sergeant, and Lieutenant throughout his career.

Sean earned Associate’s and Bachelor’s degrees in Criminal Justice.

His duties include being the Internal Affairs Officer, Training Officer, and he was charged with administering the most recent hiring process. In addition, Sean has served as the Coordinator for the Office of Emergency Management Coordinator since 2008.

Sean has attended various trainings and is a graduate of the Mid-Atlantic Law Enforcement Executive Development Seminar and the New Jersey Association of Chiefs of Police Command and Leadership Academy.

Among the awards received during his 23 years of service, Sean was honored by PBA Local 206 with the Investigative Service Award for an incident in 2001 that led to the arrest of a drug dealer in a school zone and the seizure of approximately 11 pounds of Marijuana.

The Mayor announced that holding the Bible will be his wife Cheryl Scheidle, son Matthew Scheidle and daughter Katherine Scheidle. And pinning his Badge will be his son Cody Scheidle who is also a member of the Emerson Police Department.

Judge Galasso administered the Oath of Office to Captain Sean Scheidle.

The Mayor next announced that they will be promoting Chris Bulger to Lieutenant of the Police Department. He then read a brief bio and accomplishments of Officer Bulger into the record as follows:

Promotion of Christopher T. Bulger to Lieutenant of Police

Christopher Bulger was born and raised in River Vale and joined the Police Department in 1998. He was promoted to the rank of Sergeant in 2010.

Chris earned a Bachelor of Science degree from the University of Rhode Island.

His duties include being a Field Training Officer, a Traffic Officer, and the Warrant and Scheduling Officer for the agency.

Chris has attended various trainings, including the High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area course, Certified Drug Recognition Expert program, and he is a graduate of the Mid-Atlantic Law Enforcement Executive Development Seminar.

Among the awards received during his 20 years of service, Chris was honored by PBA Local 206 with the Exceptional Duty Medal for an incident in 2010 that led to the arrest of a DWI suspect who had struck and killed a pedestrian in Jersey City and then fled the scene.

The Mayor announced that holding the Bible will be his wife Lauren Bulger and son Joseph Bulger. And pinning his Badge will be his wife Lauren Bulger.

Judge Galasso administered the Oath of Office to Lieutenant Christopher Bulger.

The Mayor next announced that they will be promoting John DeVoe to Lieutenant of the Police Department. He then read a brief bio and accomplishments of Officer DeVoe into the record as follows:

Promotion of John J. DeVoe to Lieutenant of Police

John DeVoe joined the River Vale Police Department in 1998 after serving with the Seaside Heights Police Department for 2 years. He was assigned to the Detective Bureau in 2001 and promoted to the rank of Detective Sergeant in 2010.

John earned a Bachelor of Science degree in Criminal Justice from John Jay College of Criminal Justice and a Master of Arts degree in Human Resource Training and Development from Seton Hall University.

His duties include being the Public Information Officer and the Junior Police Academy Coordinator, which he founded in 2000. In addition, John is a Senior Investigator with the Bergen County Prosecutor's Office Cyber Crimes Unit.

John has served as President of the local Detective Bureau Association since 2010 and is a Past President of the Bergen County Juvenile Officers Association.

He has attended various trainings, including the FBI National Academy, the Mid-Atlantic Law Enforcement Executive Development Seminar, and the New Jersey Association of Chiefs of Police Command and Leadership Academy.

Among the awards received during his 20 years of service, John was honored by the North Jersey Regional Crime Prevention Officers Association in 2013 as Detective of the Year.

The Mayor announced that holding the Bible will be his parents Joseph and Debra DeVoe, his sister and brother David DeVoe and JeanMarie Hall and step-daughter Jennavive Bille. And pinning his Badge will be his fiancé Karrienne Bille.

Judge Galasso administered the Oath of Office to Lieutenant John DeVoe.

The Mayor next announced that they will be promoting Pete Martin to Sergeant of the Police Department. He then read a brief bio and accomplishments of Officer Martin into the record as follows:

Promotion of Peter E. Martin to Sergeant of Police

Peter Martin joined the River Vale Police Department in 1995 and was assigned to the Detective Bureau in 2010.

Pete earned an Associate's degree in Criminal Justice from Bergen Community College.

His duties have included being the department's Senior Firearms Instructor, Evidence Technician, and Records Retention Officer.

Pete has served as President and State Delegate of Pascack Valley PBA Local 206, representing approximately 180 local police officers of the second largest PBA Local in Bergen County.

He has attended various trainings, including the High Intensity Drug Trafficking Area course and the New Mexico Tech SWAT / Anti-Terrorism program.

Among the awards received during his 22 years of service, Pete was honored by Pascack Valley PBA Local 206 in 2014 with the Meritorious Service Award for an incident in which he and other Officers subdued an emotionally disturbed female who was armed with a knife.

The Mayor announced that holding the Bible will be his daughters Samantha and Elisa. And pinning his Badge will be his brother Erik Martin and his mother Elisa Martin.

Judge Galasso administered the Oath of Office to Sergeant Peter Martin.

The Mayor next announced that they will be promoting Dino Dinelli to Sergeant of the Police Department. Mayor Jasionowski made a special mention that Officer Dinelli's mother Anna was going to hold the Bible; however, she has fallen ill and was unable to attend this evening. The Mayor asked all to keep her in their thoughts and prayers. The Mayor then read a brief bio and accomplishments of Officer Dinelli into the record as follows:

Promotion of A. Dino Dinelli to Sergeant of Police

Dino Dinelli joined the River Vale Police Department in 1999 after having worked as a Police Officer for the Stevens Institute of Technology Police Department for 3 years.

His duties include being a member of the Tactical Unit, which he created, a Field Training Officer, and a Firearms Instructor. He is also a long-time Instructor with the Junior Police Academy.

In 2001, Dino formed the department's first Motorcycle Unit by coordinating training and facilitating the donation of two motor units.

He has attended various trainings, including the Maryland State Police Motor Officer course and the New Mexico Tech SWAT/Anti-Terrorism program.

Among the awards received during his 18 years of service, Dino was honored by Pascack Valley PBA Local 206 in 2001 with the Meritorious Service Award for an incident in which he and other Officers rescued a man who was entrapped in a vehicle that was on fire following a motor vehicle crash.

The Mayor commented that he was Fire Chief at the time and recalled being at the scene of this accident. He has yet to see anything as heroic as Officer Dinelli's actions that night. He added that also attending this evening to share in Dino's success is Eric Lange then man he saved that night.

The Mayor announced that holding the Bible will be his sisters Gabriella Rasulo and Diane Reagan, his children Tyler and Alexandria and his girlfriend Brenda Bonanno. And pinning his Badge will be his father Serge Dinelli.

Judge Galasso administered the Oath of Office to Sergeant Dino Dinelli.

The Mayor next announced that they will be promoting Josh Wisse to Sergeant of the Police Department. He then read a brief bio and accomplishments of Officer Wisse into the record as follows:

Promotion of Joshua S. Wisse to Sergeant of Police

Joshua Wisse joined the River Vale Police Department in 2012 after graduating from the Camden County Police Academy as an Alternate Route candidate.

Josh earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in Criminal Justice from Rutgers University and is close to completion of his Master of Administrative Science degree in Administrative Science from Fairleigh Dickinson University.

His duties include being a Field Training Officer, Traffic Officer, and an Instructor with the Junior Police Academy. Josh also heads up the annual River Vale Police Officers Association Golf Outing.

Josh has attended various trainings, including the Rutgers Practical Traffic Engineering program and the Desert Snow Drug Interdiction course.

Among the awards received during his nearly 6 years of service, Josh was honored by the Knights of Columbus with the Shield Award in 2015, naming him Officer of the Year.

The Mayor announced that holding the Bible will be his parents Mark and Grace Wisse. And pinning his Badge will be his wife Victoria Wisse and daughter Olivia.

Judge Galasso administered the Oath of Office to Sergeant Josh Wisse.

The Mayor announced that they will be swearing in Michael Defilippis as a Police Officer. He then read a brief bio of Michael into the record as follows:

Swearing-In of Michael G. Defilippis as Police Officer

Michael Defilippis graduated from the Bergen County Law & Public Safety Institute in December 2017 as an Alternate Route candidate with Class #119.

He earned a Bachelor of Arts in Law and Justice from Rowan University, where he graduated in 2016.

Prior to his employment in River Vale, Michael served as a Class 1 Special Law Enforcement Officer and a Dispatcher with the Little Ferry Police Department from July 2016 through January 2018.

The Mayor announced that holding the Bible will be his parents Michael and Cheryl Defilippis. And pinning his Badge will be his father Michael Defilippis who is also a Port Authority Police Officer.

Judge Galasso administered the Oath of Office to Police Officer Michael Defilippis.

The Mayor next announced that they will be swearing in Michael Monforte as a Police Officer. He then read a brief bio of Michael into the record as follows:

Swearing-In of Michael T. Monforte as Police Officer

Michael Monforte graduated from the Bergen County Law & Public Safety Institute in December 2017 as an Alternate Route candidate with Class #119.

Prior to his employment in River Vale, Michael served as a Class 1 Special Law Enforcement Officer with the Little Ferry Police Department from July 2016 through January 2018.

Judge Galasso administered the Oath of Office to Police Officer Michael Monforte.
