Monday, March 11, 2019
8:00pm

CALL THE MEETING TO ORDER

Council President Bromberg called the meeting to order at 8:02pm in the Council Chambers located at 406 Rivervale Road, River Vale, New Jersey 07675.

SALUTE TO FLAG

Council President Bromberg asked all in attendance to rise and join him in a Salute to the Flag.

SUNSHINE LAW STATEMENT

Council President Bromberg read the Sunshine Statement into the record, as follows:

"In accordance with the provisions set forth in the Open Public Meetings Law, notification of this meeting has been sent to all officially appointed Township newspapers and notice is posted at the Municipal Office."

ROLL CALL

Councilman Donovan, Councilwoman Criscuolo, Councilwoman Sieg and Council President Bromberg were present. Councilman Ben-Yishay was absent.

Also present: Mayor Glen Jasionowski, Township Attorney Silvana Raso, Business Administrator/CFO Gennaro Rotella, Township Engineer Chris Statile, Township Clerk Karen Campanelli, Judge Vincent Galasso and Police Chief Sean Scheidle

Mayor's Comments

Mayor Jasionowski reserved his comments till after the swearing in of the new Officer.

Council Comments

The Council also reserved their comments.

Oath of Office – Police Officer Gregory Lis

Mayor Jasionowski announced that once again we have the privilege and opportunity to swear in another Police Officer; Gregory Lis. The Mayor reported that we continue to hire the best of the best; he is also very impressed with the way Gregory conducts himself. The Mayor congratulated Officer Lis and wished him a long and successful career in River Vale. Officer Lis's mother Christina held the Bible and his girlfriend Nicole pinned his badge.

Judge Vincent Galasso Sworn in Gregory Lis as a Police Officer with the River Vale Police Department.

Mayor's Comments

Mayor Jasionowski loves that they keep adding to the Police Department and seeing the comradery among them. He added that they are seeing the benefits already with regard to the change of schedule; overtime and expenses are down and moral is way up. Mayor Jasionowski appreciates the support the Council has given them during this process.

Council Comments

Councilman Donovan commented that it's remarkable to see all the new Officers and it's a testament to Department on their finding such good candidates.

Councilwoman Sieg wished Officer Lis the very best and River Vale is lucky to have him. She was also very impressed to see all the Officers come out to welcome him.

Councilman Criscuolo had no additional comments.

Council President Bromberg added that there was quite a showing from the Police Department this evening. He thanked the Mayor for allowing the professionals to hire the best out there from such a large pool of candidates. He added that the Department keeps growing in a great way.

Business Administrator's Report

Mr. Rotella reminded everyone about the "Around the County" visit which is scheduled for this Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday from 10:00 to 2:00. They provide passport services, senior cards, notary oaths and other services.

Township Engineer's Report

Mr. Statile reported that he is working with Rich Campanelli on this year's Road Program list. He is reviewing the plans for the Roberge School sidewalk project and they should be ready to go out to bid shortly. Mr. Statile reported that the miniature golf course is currently out to bid and work continues on updating the Tax Maps.

Mr. Statile reported that the Joint Planning Board will have another meeting on the Fairways at Edgewood application on March 28th. He next announced that the 2019 Open Space Grant applications have been approved by the County Freeholder Board and we should be receiving a Contract from the County shortly. Mr. Statile also reported that there is no word on the NJDOT grant applications at this time; however, he hopes to hear by May. He next reported that the Planning Board Chairman has asked him to look at the municipal building setback requirements for the various zones in Town. Mr. Statile explained that currently there is an averaging ordinance; however, this is awkward on the shorter blocks and corner lots. The Planning Board is requesting a standardized setback. Mr. Statile explained that people want larger back yards rather than the wide front yards common in the 70's. He further explained that they are considering moving the homes slightly closer to the street.

1st Hearing of the Public

Motion by Councilman Donovan; second by Councilwoman Sieg to open the meeting to the public.

Richard Tax—630 Montview Place—Mr. Tax reported that he has Lyme Disease as do three of his neighbors and he feels they have a significant problem on Montview Place. Mr. Tax asked if there was any way to poll people asking if they have Lyme disease.

Council President Bromberg responded that they are not permitted to ask people if they have a disease. Ms. Raso added that the Township is not in the position to ask people if they are willing to share medical information. Mayor Jasionowski commented that they know there's an issue that needs to be fixed; whether the number is 1 or 100.

Council President Bromberg agreed with the Mayor. He explained that they recognize that there is an issue and the vector that is of concern is the deer and that they will be deciding on a plan.

Jim Hanna—381 Sunset—Mr. Hanna commented that there are going to be a lot of big changes in River Vale particularly with regard to the Edgewood development. He stated that the Police Department has a drone and suggested using it to record what Edgewood Country Club looks like today to keep as a part of history. Mr. Hanna further suggested doing this with any future changes coming to River Vale. Mayor Jasionowski agreed that this is a good idea.

The Mayor commented that he is going to ask the Council President for a short Closed Session at the next meeting regarding the Township possibly purchasing property for historic purposes. He added that Mr. Hanna will be invited to this meeting.

There being no further questions or comments from the public. Motion by Councilman Criscuolo; second by Councilwoman Sieg to close the meeting to the public.

Section 2. The Mayor or his designee is hereby authorized to determine the salary of each employee within each salary range annually, such determination and salary to be effective the first day of each calendar year beginning 2019.

Section 3. All employees shall be paid on the 15th and 30th of every month as stipulated in the Township Personnel Manual except for changes required on account of calendar year requirements.

Section 4. All parts or ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed as to such inconsistent parts, but nothing herein contained shall be construed to authorize any salary decrease. This ordinance shall take effect after passage in the manner provided by law, except that any and all such salary increases shall in all respects be subject to any provisions of law.

Section 5. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision, and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.
